stronger. We have a national and even international family, we have a district family and even have a group of churches nearby that consider us as part of that family – even if it’s that kind of crazy cousin that you only see on holidays and weddings and funerals.

I say all that for a reason. For the past 4 Sundays, our congregation has participated in Lenten Services with our sister churches just north of the border. I use the word “participated” very liberally, though, because really, we haven’t. I have been very disappointed, even hurt by my congregation’s failure to take part in these services. Apart from Acela and I, there was not one of these services where there was more than one additional couple in attendance. Only Julie and Lynn and John and Judy. I can hear people saying, “but they were so far away.” The furthest service was not more than 45 minutes from the church here. Most all of us run to Danville or Greensboro or Burlington without giving it much of a thought.

This Sunday evening is the final in the series here at our church. I hope that you will take this opportunity seriously and join together with family to worship and celebrate our Lord, Jesus Christ. Rant over and I still love you!

And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the
