And just like that, it's all over. The bunnies and plastic eggs are put away for another year. The chocolate has been eaten. The last pieces of leftover ham sit drying out in the back corner of the refrigerator. The beautifully decorated hard boiled eggs, peeled, their yolks mixed with mustard and mayo and refilled have all been devoured. The cantata has been sung All the trappings of Easter are that quickly gone. But one thing remains. The empty tomb. All the details, the decorations, the celebrations — those things don't really matter. What matters is Christ, Him crucified and resurrected from the dead.

On the day of Christ's resurrection, two disciples — Cleopas and maybe his wife, who was likely at the foot of the cross (see John 19:25) — were walking on the road, heading toward their home in Emmaus. As they walked, they were talking together about what had happened over the past few days. When Jesus came to walk with them, they shared their pain and heartache. And after chastising them a little for being hard headed, he reminded them of prophecy and demonstrated that he was the fulfillment of that prophecy.

Jesus was able to enter that conversation because they were having a conversation. They were talking about what Jesus had done. They were ready to hear directly from him.

We need to ready ourselves. We need to have conversations among ourselves about what Jesus has done for us. We need to share with one another how the Holy Spirit moves in our lives. We are sometimes hesitant to have these conversations, even with fellow believers. But we need to have those conversations so that we are prepared to have conversations with those who need to hear the gospel. And it is when we have those conversations that Jesus will join in.

Now that same day two of them were going to a village called Emmaus, about seven miles from Jerusalem. They were talking with each other about everything that had happened. As they talked and discussed these things with each other, Jesus himself came up and walked along with them;

Luke 24:13-15

Staying sharp

The English word *character* comes from Greek for a sharp-pointed instrument. Much of this original meaning is implied in the word as we use it, for isn't character the means by which we make an impression on the world? To be sure, the instrument itself is not a finished product [but] a mere tool; but, like many a fine instrument, character improves with use. Our actions and reactions temper the blade and make the edge powerful or impotent. We each must forge our own character, be responsible for keeping it in condition and be responsible for its results.
